Crisis Intervention Team Training

Free for law enforcement—police, deputies, corrections, probation, parole, dispatchers, etc.

CIT programs are local initiatives designed to improve the way law enforcement and the community respond to people experiencing mental health crises. They are built on strong partnerships between law enforcement, mental health provider agencies, and individuals and families affected by mental illness. Over 220 police and corrections officers from 28 jurisdictions have completed **CIT** training in Trumbull County since 2006.
