# Crisis Intervention Team Training

**Free for law enforcement—police, deputies, troopers, rangers, corrections, probation, parole, dispatchers, etc.**

**CIT** programs are local initiatives designed to improve the way law enforcement and the community respond to people experiencing a behavioral health crisis. They are built on strong partnerships between law enforcement, behavioral health agencies, and individuals and families affected by mental illness or addiction. Over 300 officers from 32 jurisdictions have completed **CIT** training in Trumbull County since 2006.
