### **Coleman Professional Services:**

Continuum of Care (CoC) Supportive Housing Voucher Program and Permanent Supportive Housing. Verification of homelessness and disability. HUD funded Grants. Limited housing vouchers for adults in recovery (mental health and/or substance use disorders).

Joey's Landing: 8 - one-bedroom units, Permanent Supportive Housing for homeless individuals in recovery from Severe and Persistent Mental Illness. Must meet the federal definition for homelessness and have a documented disability.

Washington House: 8 bedrooms. Permanent Supportive Housing for men in recovery from a behavioral health disorder. Must meet federal definition of homelessness and have a documented disability.

- Transition in Place (TIP)- A permanent housing option. Rent or utilities for Veteran for the 3 months; Veteran takes over lease after completion of 6–9 month program.
- Traditional Grant & Per Diem (GPD)- 24/365 facility. 10 bed temporary housing wing located at Meridian HealthCare in Youngstown. For Veterans working with VA, SSVF and other housing programs to obtain permanent housing. Each Veteran has private room and share common areas. Serving Chronically Homeless with mental health and



substance use issues. Coordinated services leading to permanent housing and Bridge Housing (Veterans served by SSVF or HUD/VASH) provided.

#### **Service Center grant**

- Clothing, pantry, coats, blankets, hygiene products for Veterans.
